After graduating from the Bible Training Institute, Glasgow, he became the pastor of Maryport Street Baptist Chapel, Devizes, Wiltshire. He married Margaret in 1977 and they have four children - two sons and two daughters. Since May 1991, he has been the pastor of Holywell Evangelical Church, Holywell, Flintshire, North Wales. He is the current editor of the Bible League Quarterly, a magazine started in 1892 a few months after the death of C. H. Spurgeon, "to promote the reverent study of the Holy Scriptures, and to resist the varied attacks made upon their inspiration, infallibility and sole sufficiency as the Word of God". He is the author of a number of booklets and has spoken in various conferences.
